WIS 50 Reconstruction | 117th to 43rd Avenues | Kenosha

July 24, 2023

The Wisconsin Department of Transportation (WisDOT) has substantially completed the reconstruction of WIS 50 (75th Street) between 117th and 43rd avenues in Kenosha County. The four mile project began in 2021 with the goals of increasing safety and access throughout the corridor, easing traffic in high-density areas, and improving the transportability of goods and freight. Minor work remains to be finalized throughout the summer.

The project team thanks you for your patience and cooperation throughout this project!

WORK COMPLETED:

- Widened WIS 50 from a four to six-lane divided roadway between 117th and 57th avenues.
- Reconstructed WIS 50 with new concrete between 57th and 43rd avenues.
- Reconstructed and widened the bridge structures at Canadian Pacific Railroad, 77th Avenue, and Union Pacific Railroad.
- Constructed upgraded traffic signals at eight intersections to improve motorist and pedestrian safety.
- Upgraded and added sidewalks and bicycle lanes throughout the project limits.
- Modified property access throughout the project limits to improve safety.
