Over the past year, the Village stayed true to its mission to promote and preserve investment in our community. As a result, 2021 was a year filled with progress and economic growth. Prairie Highlands Corporate Park saw significant improvements at the HARIBO manufacturing facility and a grand opening ceremony for Nexus Pharmaceuticals. The new Kroger fulfillment center on Highway H completed exterior work and is now working on internal functions to automate grocery fulfillment to serve Wisconsin, northern Illinois, and northwest Indiana households. Additionally, the Village created Tax Incremental District #8 to finance public infrastructure improvements for the multiphase developments south of Highway 50 between 104th and 115th Avenues. Finally, Main Street Market introduced a new Kwik Trip location and widened a section of Old Green Bay Road to accommodate increased traffic in the area.

Throughout 2021, the Village employees provided high-quality municipal services such as garbage, recycling, elections, sewer, water, road maintenance, police, and fire and rescue. The Pleasant Prairie Police Department, established in 1971, celebrated 50 years of serving the community. The Fire & Rescue Department introduced a new rescue pumper truck and brought back their annual Safety Day in the Prairie. In addition, the Pleasant Prairie Historical Society hosted a grand opening ceremony, delayed due to the pandemic, for the Pleasant Prairie History Museum to unveil new exhibits at the historic Dublin School. The Village Board, staff, and community members living and working in Pleasant Prairie aim to maintain stability and make the Village a great place to live, work, and play.

I want to thank you for supporting the work we do in Pleasant Prairie. As a Village, we value collaboration, professionalism, quality, and vision. Please consider joining us in 2022 as an active community member by attending public meetings, volunteering for community events, exercising your right to vote, and enjoying community resources. In addition, I encourage you to take some time to enjoy the natural areas within the Village by taking a walk, biking a trail, visiting our local parks, and relaxing by your favorite lake.

Voter Registration

Qualifications In order to vote in the Village of Pleasant Prairie, you must be a registered voter. The State of Wisconsin has set the following minimum requirements to register: you must be 18 years of age on Election Day; you must be a U.S. citizen; and you must reside in the Village of Pleasant Prairie for at least 28 consecutive days before an election.

Registration Options and Deadlines

- **By mail.** Up to 20 days before the election. Registration forms should be mailed to your municipal clerk. You can start your voter registration form online at myvote.wi.gov. Your form must be printed, signed, and mailed or delivered, to your municipal clerk.
- **Online.** Up to 20 days before the election. Voters who have a valid State of Wisconsin Driver License or State of Wisconsin ID card issued by the Wisconsin Division of Motor Vehicles (DMV) can register to vote online on the **MyVote Wisconsin** website at myvote.wi.gov.
- **Municipal Clerk's Office.** You may register in-person in your municipal clerk's office up until the Friday before the election until 5:00 p.m.
- **At the polls.** You may register at the polls on Election Day.

Voter Registration Application Voter Registration Applications are available at Village Hall, 9915 39th Avenue. You may also download this application from the Village website, PleasantPrairieWi.gov. A Voter Registration Application must be completed for all name and address changes.

Proof of Residence is a document that proves where you live in Wisconsin and is only used when registering to vote. All voters MUST provide Proof of Residence when registering. If you register to vote by mail, in-person in your clerk's office, or at your polling place on Election Day, you need to provide a Proof of Residence.

All Proof of Residence documents must include voter's name & current residential address

- A current and valid State of Wisconsin Driver License or State ID card.
- Any other official identification card or license issued by a Wisconsin governmental body or unit.
- Any identification card issued by an employer in the normal course of business and bearing a photo of the card holder, but not including a business card.
- A real estate tax bill or receipt for the current year or the year preceding the date of the election.
- A university, college, or technical college identification card (must include photo) ONLY if the voter provides a fee receipt dated within the last 9 months or the institution provides a certified housing list to the municipal clerk.
- A gas, electric, or telephone service statement (utility bill) for the period commencing no earlier than 90 days before Election Day.
- Bank or credit card statement.
- Paycheck or paystub.
- A check or other document issued by a unit of government.
- A letter on public or private social service agency letterhead identifying a homeless voter and

Voter Photo Identification

The Voter Photo ID law is in effect. All residents requesting an absentee ballot, by mail or in-person at the Clerk's office, or voting at the polls on Election Day will be required to provide a valid document establishing their proof of identification before a ballot will be issued.

Acceptable Photo Identification

The following photo IDs are acceptable for voting purposes, **and can be unexpired or expired after, November 3, 2020 (current date of the last General Election):**

- A Wisconsin DOT-issued driver license, even if driving privileges are revoked or suspended
- A Wisconsin DOT-issued identification card
- Military ID card issued by the U.S. Uniformed Services
- A U.S. passport book or card

The following photo IDs are also acceptable for voting purposes:

- A certificate of naturalization (that was issued not earlier than two years before the date of the election)
- Tribal ID card (still valid for voting if expired)
- A driver license receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days from date issued)
- An identification card receipt issued by Wisconsin DOT (valid for 45 days from date issued)
- A Wisconsin DMV ID Petition Process Photo Receipt (valid for 60 days from date issued)
- A Veteran Affairs ID card (must be unexpired or have no expiration date)
- A student ID card plus enrollment verification (if expired) Only valid for voting if the expiration date is no more than two years from the date the card was issued. Still valid for voting if expired.

describing the individual's residence for voting purposes.

- Residential lease that is effective on date of registration. (Not valid if registering by mail.)
- An intake document from a residential care facility such as a nursing home or assisted living facility.

This is not a comprehensive list, but categories of the most common types used by voters.

Voting by Absentee Ballot

Qualifications You must be a qualified registered voter of the Village of Pleasant Prairie. You may request an absentee ballot by election, calendar year or permanent. Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized or in service as a sequestered juror. Contact the Village Clerk directly if any of these situations apply.

To Receive an Absentee Ballot by Mail

- An Application for Absentee Ballot requests can be submitted through the **MyVoteWisconsin** website at myvote.wi.gov or in person, by mail, email or facsimile transmission.
- An Application for Absentee Ballot may be downloaded from the Village website at PleasantPrairieWi.gov.
- A written request, other than using the Application of Absentee Ballot form, must list your current name and current voting address within the municipality and the address where the absentee ballot should be sent.
- Absentee Ballot requests must be submitted in writing when requesting a ballot be sent by mail.
- The last day to submit a request for an Absentee Ballot to be sent by mail is 4:30 p.m. on the Thursday before each election.
- **PHOTO ID IS REQUIRED** – a valid form of photo identification must be submitted with a request for an absentee ballot to be sent by mail (military, overseas and indefinitely confined voters are exempt).

In Person Absentee Voting

- In person absentee voting is conducted at the Village Hall located at 9915 39th Avenue. In-person absentee voting begins 14 days prior to Election Day. The hours for in-person absentee voting will be regular business hours Monday through Friday, between 7:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., except for the Friday preceeding the election. Additional information for each election can be found on our website.
- **PHOTO ID IS REQUIRED** – a valid form of photo identification must be presented before an absentee ballot will be issued (please see page 4).

SOLIDWASTE SERVICES

Garbage

Village garbage and recycling carts must be used as your primary receptacles for garbage and recycling collection. Using the carts properly helps keep collection costs lower for our community.

General Garbage Guidelines

- Bag your garbage and place the bag into your Village garbage cart.
- Wheel your garbage cart to the curb or roadside by **6:30 a.m.** on the morning of your collection day.
- Your cart should be placed 5 feet away from any obstructions (poles, cars, mailboxes, etc.) and on the opposite side of your driveway than your recycling cart.
- The cart should open towards the street.
- Garbage and recycling carts should not be placed at the roadside more than 12 hours before your collection day.
- Remove empty garbage and recycling carts from the curb within 12 hours of your collection.
- Garbage and Recycling will not be collected if it is mixed together in the same container.
- Please shovel or clear the area at the roadside during winter weather.
- Depending on your route, garbage may not be picked up until **3:00 p.m.** Call **262.925.6700** if you have problems with your pick-up.

Garbage Cart Contents

It is illegal to place the following items in your garbage cart: lead acid batteries, white goods (see page 8), waste oil, recyclable items (at right), tires, compost, antifreeze, concrete, stone, dirt/clay (see page 11), cell phones (see page 9), hazardous or toxic materials (see page 7), and electronic devices (see page 9).

Remodeling/Construction Debris

More than modest amounts of construction and remodeling debris will not be collected as part of standard "unlimited" garbage collection. For larger remodeling or construction projects, residents should hire a dumpster service to handle large amounts of debris.

Penalties

Fees and penalties for violations have been defined in a garbage ordinance (see Chapter 292 of the municipal code). A process for notifying residents of noncompliance with the garbage and recycling guidelines has also been established.

Recycling

In Wisconsin, you cannot put any recyclable or compostable items in the trash. Wisconsin's recycling law bans the landfilling or incineration of recyclable materials to conserve valuable resources. **Recycling more also helps our community save money.** Due to steadily increasing landfill costs and a consistently lower cost for recycling services, the more items you recycle, the lower we can keep garbage and recycling costs for the community. Thank you to all who make an effort to recycle.

Village recycling carts should be used as your primary receptacle for recyclables. Items on the list below should be rinsed and placed in your recycle cart for collection. As a reminder, food containers that are recyclable should be clean and free from food remnants (e.g. a pizza box is recyclable so long as any melted cheese and other food remnants are removed from the container).

What Should Be Placed In Your Recycling Cart?

Do not bag your recycling. This includes plastic recyclable and bio-degradable bags.

- Cardboard and boxboard (unlined merchandise boxes)
- Newspapers and magazines
- Catalogs, flyers, and junk mail
- Telephone and paperback books
- Untreated office papers (typing, copy or printer paper)
- Stationery, envelopes and bills
- Brown paper bags
- Clean plastic containers and bottles (marked with recyclable numbers 1-7)
- Clean glass bottles
- Clean aluminum or steel (tin) cans



Please have your recycling cart to the roadside by **6:30 a.m.** on your scheduled pick-up day. An automated collection truck (with a single operator) will collect your recycling. Please face the opening of the cart towards the road and ensure that the bin is five feet away from your garbage cart and any other item or obstruction.

Hazardous Waste Collection

What Are Hazardous Wastes?

Household hazardous wastes are common products found in the home. People usually store these materials for a time and eventually discard the unwanted items and their containers. When products are used according to label directions, most are not hazardous. They may become hazardous, however, if you use or store them improperly. Environmental problems can arise if you dispose of products improperly. **DO NOT BURN, BURY, DUMP, (in yard, toilet or down a storm sewer) or MIX leftover products.** Chemical containers should not be reused for any other purpose.

How To Dispose of Hazardous Wastes

Village residents can dispose of their hazardous wastes during Household Hazardous Waste Collection. This takes place at the Kenosha County Municipal Center on Saturday, May 7. The Village also accepts hazardous waste at the Residential Recycling Center on the first Saturday of every month with the exception of January and May.

You may bring any products that say: Caution, Combustible, Corrosive, Danger, Flammable, Pesticide, Poison, Reactive, Toxic or Warning. We will recycle or dispose of it in an environmentally safe manner. **We are not able to accept:** biological material or medical wastes, commercial waste, propane cylinders, explosives, radioactive materials, latex paint (not considered hazardous) or tires (see page 11). Why Recycle?

The costs associated with disposing of garbage in a landfill are substantially higher than the costs associated with recycling clean materials. This reality has an impact on and a direct relationship to the efforts of every household in our community on a daily basis. While Village staff works consciously to keep garbage and recycling costs as low as possible, this is one goal we cannot accomplish without every household's help. Please help us keep garbage and recycling costs under control by keeping recyclable items out of the garbage stream. Wisconsin's recycling law bans the landfilling or incineration of recyclable materials.

How to Recycle

Identify which items are recyclable (see page 6); rinse any plastic, glass, or metal recyclables and place them in your recycle bin. Recyclables are picked up every other week. To learn when your collection day is, or to order a second recycling bin, call **262.925.6700**.

SOLIDWASTE SERVICES

Bulk Items

Bulk items are considered any item larger than 3 feet by 18 inches and/or weighing more than 50 pounds. Some examples of bulk items are furniture, mattresses, and swing sets.

Bulk Item Pickup

- Call Public Works at **262.925.6700** by **noon** on Tuesday to schedule a pick-up for the following day.
- There is a \$25 fee for each bulk item pick-up. The fee will be added to your Utility Bill.
- Bulk items will be scheduled for pick-up on Wednesdays only. Please call to schedule a specific week.
- If you need to reschedule for any reason, please call to cancel by noon on the Tuesday prior to the scheduled collection. You will be charged a \$25 fee for any collection canceled after **4:00 p.m.** on Tuesday.
- For an additional bulk item disposal option, please see page 11.

Disassembling bulk items to smaller than 3 feet by 18 inches and fewer than 50 pounds enables you to dispose of them as solid waste (at right).

Computers and Televisions

You can also call to have your old computer or television collected as a special pick-up. Pick-up for these items (TV or computer) will be scheduled on Fridays. A tiered fee is charged for each item. More information about computer and television disposal is available on page 9, at PleasantPrairieWi.gov or by calling **262.925.6700**.

Solid Waste

The Village of Pleasant Prairie considers garbage other than typical household waste to be solid waste. Examples of solid waste are clean lumber, carpet and padding, plywood, drywall, windows and scrap. In order to have solid waste items collected, they must be no larger than 3 feet by 18 inches and weigh no more than 50 pounds. Items must be small enough to fit into your garbage cart.

Carpeting, padding and rugs must be cut or folded into 3-foot widths and be rolled and tied or taped. The weight limit per roll is 50 pounds.

Windows can be no larger than 3 feet by 18 inches. Tape an "X" with heavy duty tape across the glass on both sides to prevent breakage.

Lumber must be cut into 3-foot lengths or smaller, tied or taped into bundles, or placed in your garbage cart.

Paneling, plywood, drywall and plaster board must be cut into sections no larger than 3 feet by 18 inches and bundled, bagged or placed in your garbage cart. The weight limit is 50 pounds per bag, cart or bundle.

- White goods will be scheduled for pick-up on Fridays only. Please call to schedule a specific week.
- If you need to reschedule for any reason, please call and cancel by noon on the Thursday prior to the scheduled collection. You will be charged a \$25 fee for any collection canceled after **4:00 p.m.** on Thursday.
- White goods must be placed curbside for collection by **6:30 a.m.** on Friday.

To keep costs lower for all residents by preventing costly damage to equipment, residents should remove all wreaths, garlands, lights, ornaments, other metal objects, tree bags, tree stands, and nails. Then drop your holiday tree inside the fenced area. **Holiday Tree Drop-off sites are for Village residential use only.**

Options for Disposal of Televisions and Computers

Because it is illegal to dispose of your old televisions and computers along with your regular garbage, the Village of Pleasant Prairie offers two options to help you dispose of these items. You can choose either a curbside collection or a drop-off option. While curbside collection can sometimes be more convenient, the drop-off option offers you a cost savings. The Village has a tiered fee schedule that takes into account various television sizes and the type of television.

To Schedule a Pickup

If you would like to schedule a curbside collection for your old television or home computer, call the Department of Public Works at **262.925.6700** by noon on Thursday to schedule a pick-up for the following day, Friday. The fee associated with your pick-up will be added to your monthly Utility Bill.

These items will be scheduled for pick-up on Fridays only. If you need to reschedule for any reason, please call and cancel by noon on the Thursday prior to the scheduled collection. You will be charged for any collection canceled after **4:00 p.m.** on the Thursday prior to your collection.

To Use the Drop-off Option

If you would prefer to drop off your old television or home computer at the Residential Recycling Center, simply visit the center during the hours listed on page 11. A member of the department will take your information, determine the fee associated with your particular television size and type, and direct you to the drop-off location. The fee for the items you drop off will be added to your monthly Utility Bill.

Options for Disposal of Miscellaneous Electronic Items

E-Cycle Wisconsin, supported by the State's electronics recycling law, created a program for electronics recycling that is overseen by the Department of Natural Resources (DNR). Under the law, several types of electronic devices are banned from landfills and incineration.

Items Banned from Landfills

- desktop computers
- desktop printers, including printers combined with fax machines, scanners and copiers
- video display devices of at least 7" long in the longest diagonal dimension, including TVs, laptops and computer monitors
- computer peripherals, including keyboards, mice, hard drives, scanners, speakers, flash drives, external modems and other devices
- DVD players, DVRs, VCRs and other video players
- fax machines
- cell phones

How to Dispose of Banned Items

Village residents needing to dispose of electronics items listed above may use the Residential Recycling Center, located at 8000 128th Street, or you may call to schedule a curbside collection. Miscellaneous electronic devices, including DVD players, DVRs, VCRs and other video players, may be dropped off at the Residential Recycling Center for a \$5 fee per item. Residential Leaf Collection

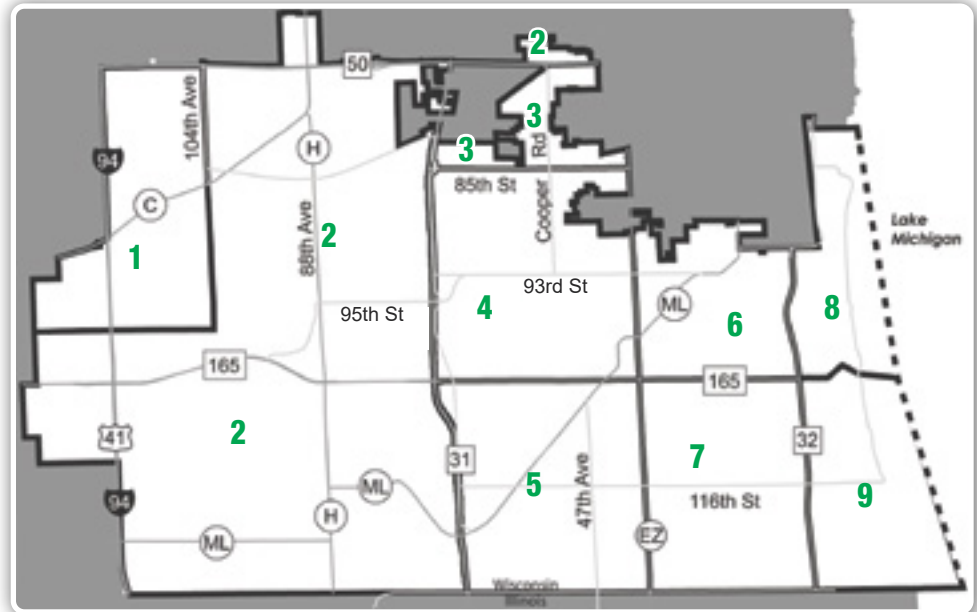
As part of the Solid Waste Services provided to Village residents, on a seasonal basis, Village crews collect loose, unbagged leaves directly from your curb or roadside. Below at the right, you will see the 2022 leaf collection schedule. In order to have your leaves collected, please follow the steps below. The guidelines help keep leaf collection on schedule and help keep costs lower for the community.

Leaf Collection Guidelines

- See the leaf collection map at right to identify your collection zone.
- See the leaf collection schedule at right to determine your collection dates.
- Have loose leaves ready by **7:00 a.m.** on your collection dates.
- To prepare your leaves, rake your loose, fallen leaves into a pile at your curb or on your roadside.
- **Leaves must be within six feet of the asphalt road to be collected.**
- Please keep leaves off the asphalt.
- For residents with curbs and gutters, please place loose leaves on the grass by the curb.
- For residents with a ditch line, please place loose leaves on the grass along the roadside of the ditch.
- Because leaves are vacuumed into the collection truck, they must be piled loose.
- Bagged leaves or grass, branches and other yard waste will not be collected.
- **Do not mix other yard waste, such as potted/garden plants or branches, into your pile of leaves. Doing so can damage the leaf collection vacuum and may cause costly delays. Leaves mixed with other yard waste will not be collected.**

Please keep in mind that though collection staff abides by the schedule at the right, there are certain circumstances that may delay collection by one or more days. These circumstances could include: unanticipated delays due to weather, emergency situations that may draw staff away from their regular duties, or damage to collection equipment which would require repair or unscheduled service.

If you miss your collection dates, yard waste can also be dropped off at the Residential Recycling Center at 8000 128th Street. For a complete schedule of Residential Recycling Center hours, please see page 11.

Hours & Options

Pleasant Prairie operates a Residential Recycling Center for Village residents. The center will be open for on-season hours between March 21 and December 2, weather permitting. The Residential Recycling Center will remain open on Saturdays between **7:00 a.m.** and **4:00 p.m.** throughout the off-season (December through March).

The center is easy to use, with convenient drop-off hours and options and free items for Village residents - compost, wood chips and mulch. Drop-off options can help you work around those times when you need more flexibility with your disposal options, like dropping off your garbage and recycling before you leave for a vacation. *Please note that the Residential Recycling Center is closed on the first Wednesday of each month in order to accommodate safe grinding operations.

The Residential Recycling Center is located at 8000 128th Street. When using the center, please be prepared to provide proof of residence in Pleasant Prairie. If you frequent the site, for your convenience, you can request a Residential Recycling Center sticker for your automobile window.

Drop Off

To accommodate those times when collection at your home is not convenient, you can drop select items at the Residential Recycling Center during the hours of operation listed to the left. A fee is charged to cover the cost of handling and disposing of your item.

Compost, Wood Chips and Mulch

Compost, wood chips, and mulch are available to Village residents at the Residential Recycling Center on a first-come, first-served basis during the hours listed at the left.

We all live in a watershed

Each of us can have a positive impact on the future of our local waters

While our local waters are healthier than they were a decade ago, they still face major challenges. One such challenge is non-point pollution which is carried to our rivers and lakes by stormwater and snow melt. Larger storm sewers or treatment plants won't solve this challenge; this challenge requires community action.

Stormwater runoff is the rain and melting snow that flows off of streets, rooftops and lawns. The flowing water carries road salts, sand, soil, pesticides, fertilizers, leaves and grass clippings, oil, litter and many other pollutants into nearby waterways. Each of us contributes to stormwater pollution, and each of us can help stop it.

Here are some ways you can contribute to cleaner waters:

- Inspect your car regularly and repair oil and fluid leaks
- Take your car to the car wash or wash it on your lawn
- Mulch grass clippings, leave them on your lawn or compost them
- Clean up after your pets at home and when out-and-about
- Direct downspouts into rain barrels, your yard, or your garden
- Test your soil before you fertilize
- Plant a rain garden or a tree
- Dispose of hazardous wastes properly

Protect families and our water supply with medication collection

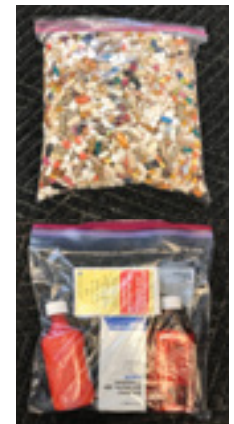
Unused pharmaceuticals kept in your home beyond their original intended use can cause harm to people if taken accidentally or intentionally misused. Drug abuse prevention forces and environmental groups encourage all of us to properly dispose of unused pharmaceuticals.

Disposing of pharmaceuticals can make them inaccessible to children or people at risk of addiction, while disposing of them correctly keeps these medications from further contaminating our drinking water supply.

- **Don't flush medications down your toilet**
- **Don't dump medications down your drain**
- **Use medication collection sites**
- **Watch local news for medication collection events**

A permanent medication drop-box, available Monday - Friday, 7:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., is located in the lobby of the **Pleasant Prairie Police Department at 8600 Green Bay Road**. A list of acceptable items is printed on the outside of the box (**not acceptable items: inhalers, needles, or sharps in the box**).

To have the box be more efficient, remove unwanted medications out of its original container and place into a resealable plastic zipper storage bag (see top image). Liquid medications can be kept in their individual containers but must be put in a separate resealable plastic zipper storage bag (see bottom image).
